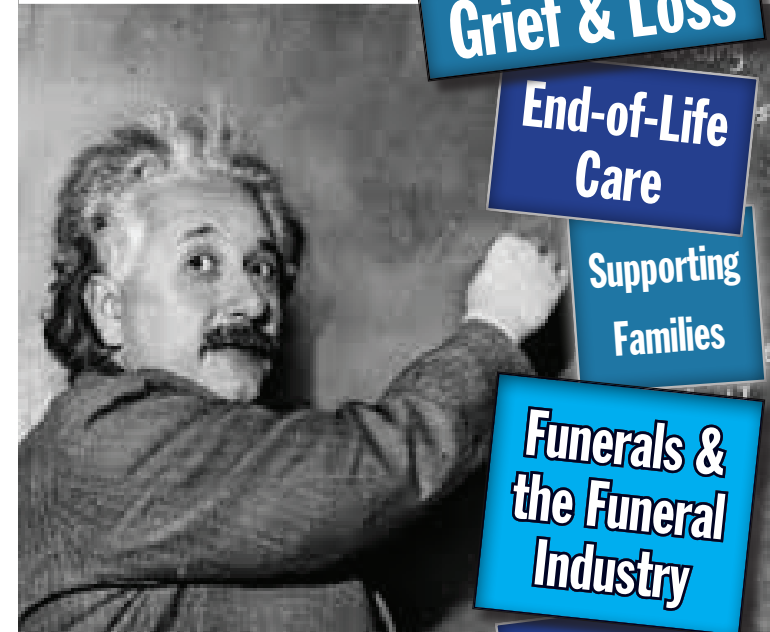

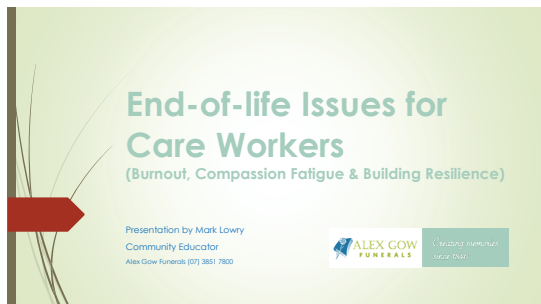

End of Life Issues for Care Workers (Burnout, Compassion Fatigue & Building Resilience)

This presentation looks specifically at the issues that staff working within an end-of-life situation face and discusses how to minimise and manage the impact of this demanding work.



The Changing Face of Grief & Bereavement

Within this presentation we take an overview of how our understanding of grief and bereavement has changed over time. Specifically, we look at how theories of grief have changed throughout the 20th Century and where our thinking is currently.



Supporting Families & Working with Difficult People

This presentation came out of feedback from staff at different organisations asking about how to better support families of residents, and how to deal with 'difficult' family members. We primarily look at best practice ideas for working with families in difficult & stressful situations, but we also briefly consider the fact that 'difficult' people exist in all walks of life in all situations and that often the best we can do is to better manage their difficulties rather than changing them.



The History of Funerals & the Funeral Industry (Is a funeral really necessary?)

We take a historical look at the funeral in general and the growth of the funeral industry itself. We also ask whether the funeral ritual is relevant anymore, and look specifically at Dr Alan Wolfelt's six reconciliation needs of mourning.



Fun Art Workshops

We are also offering different art workshops throughout the year. These include card making, zen tangles and colouring in, paper-clay flower making and water colours. These workshops generally run for 60-90 minutes, can cater for 10-15 people, and are designed to be interactive, inclusive and fun, fun, fun!

What Happens to My Loved-One After They Have Died?

This is a presentation that explains what happens to a loved-one from the moment they come into our care to the moment they leave. We follow the process of transferring, caring for, and preparing a loved-one for burial or cremation within our funeral home.
