PLAYING CODE CRACKER

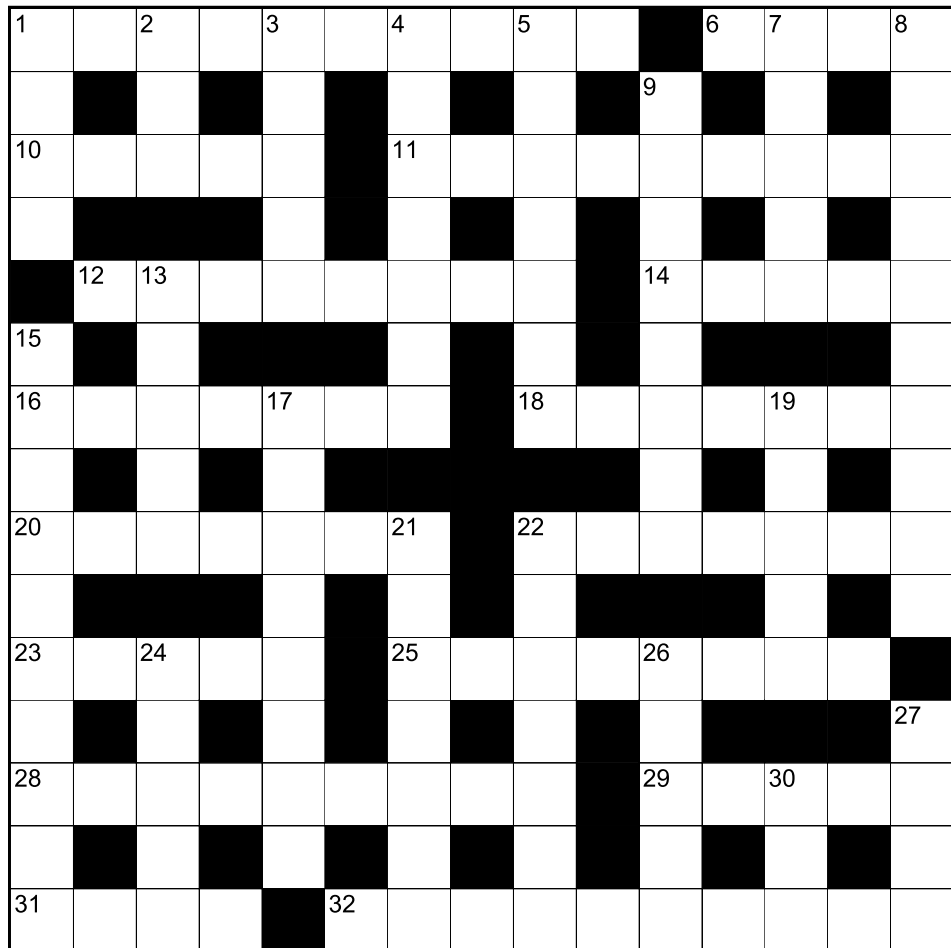
