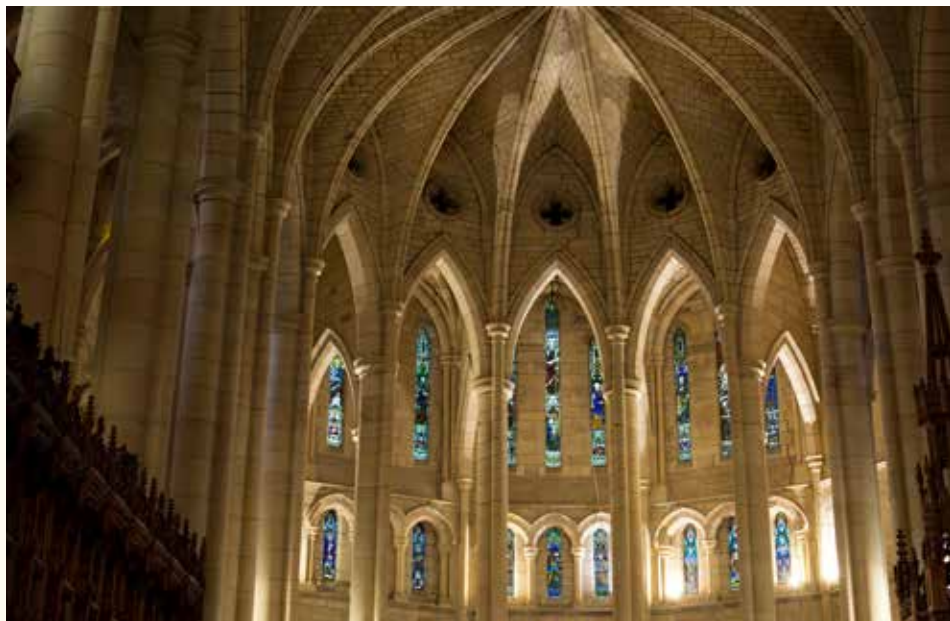

### **PLAYING CODE CRACKER**

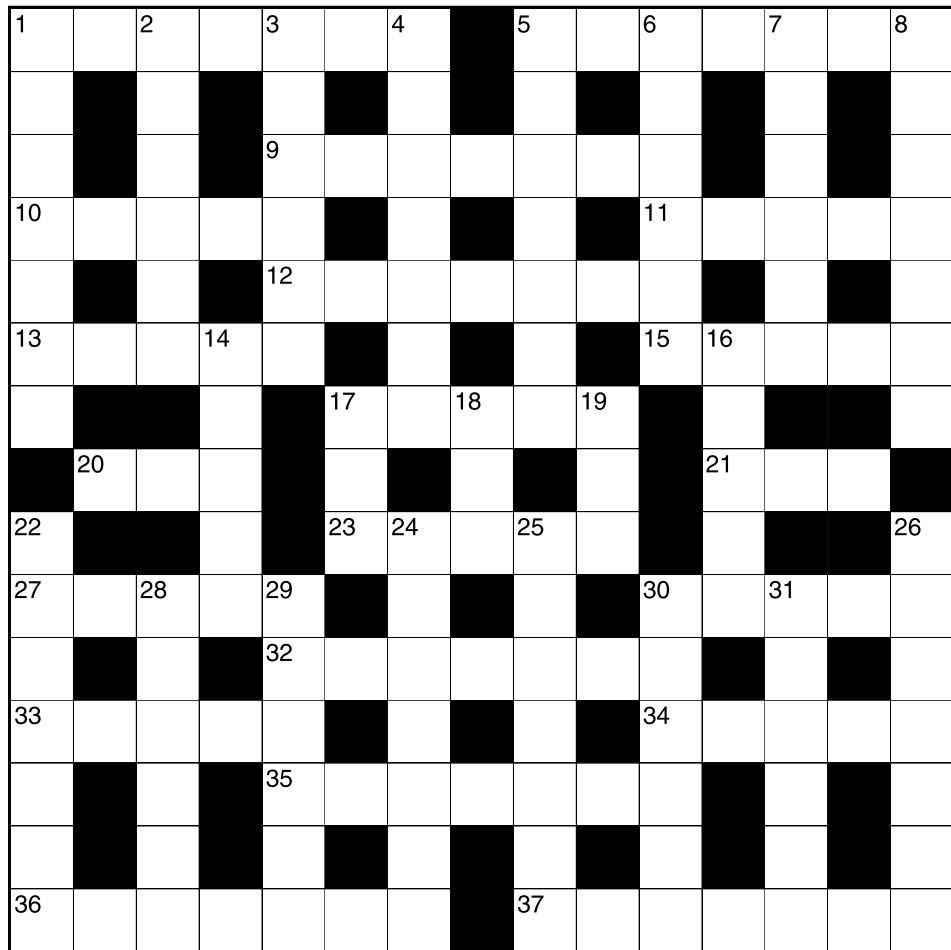
